Welcome to the Summer '21 news sheet and my first one as the new Chair of the Association.

We have a number of exciting events coming up that we felt could not wait for the September newsletter. Our President, Dominic Hartley OS86, (the first President younger than me – sad milestone!) describes Thirst Fridays and his plans for the annual dinner next February in his piece below. Given our collective, restricted experience over the last 18 months, I anticipate that people will be keen to book their places at a great new venue in the City for what will be a really wonderful evening.

Our immediate past President, Tim Livesey OS77, has again arranged some fascinating seminars in our "Towards a Better Politics" series. Two of these will be online: Canon Dr Angus Ritchie, executive director of the Centre for Theology and Community will speak on Tuesday 28th September and Jonathan Tonge, Professor of Politics at Liverpool University, will speak on Tuesday 26th October. Dr Ritchie is an Anglican priest who has ministered in inner city parishes and has been involved in community organising since 1998. Pope Francis has praised his ideas, saying they are about finding the means to guarantee a life for all people that is worthy of being called human, a life capable of cultivating virtue and forging new bonds. Professor Tonge is a specialist in Northern Ireland matters and his topic is the highly topical "Towards a Better Politics in Northern Ireland". Both events will start at 6pm and will last an hour. These events are not restricted to Association members and we encourage you to invite your friends and colleagues from around the world to attend. They do need to register separately for the event however.

We hope to arrange an in-person or possibly hybrid event in November. Further details will be circulated when available.

In the Autumn the College will be hosting the first reunions to take place for quite some time. There are currently more requests for reunions than the College is able to accommodate, so we ask for a little patience while the backlog is reduced.

John Browne, the Headmaster of Stonyhurst, and Stephen Withnell OS95, Deputy Head (External), have generously given up their time to attend all the recent Association Committee meetings and it has been immensely cheering to hear how well the College has addressed the Covid pandemic and the many other challenges that inevitably arise. If current planning and Covid assumptions hold firm, then the number of students attending the College and SMH in September may be the highest since the closure of Beaumont and the Stonyhurst Foundation is putting a Stonyhurst education within reach of more and more families.

I record my enormous thanks to my predecessor, Simon Andrews OS68, for his sterling contribution to the College and Association over several decades. I will struggle to fill Simon's shoes but will try to promote the Stonyhurst Association as a progressive, outward-looking force for good in the world in addition to its important role in supporting the College. I welcome all ideas to this end and can be contacted via the Association office.

On behalf of the Association Committee I offer my thoughts and prayers to the whole of the Stonyhurst family.

February 26th 2022 - Association Annual Dinner, at the Pan Pacific Hotel, London. A booking form will be emailed to all shortly


From Dominic Hartley OS86, Association President 2021-2022
